



1. SSVF - Supportive Services for Veteran Families

Assist qualifying veterans and their families with:

- Rapid re-housing, for the literally homeless
 - We assist veterans with case management, budget counseling, job searching, finding housing, security deposits, utility deposits, rent, and become stable in their new home
- Prevention services, for those at imminent risk of losing their housing
 - We assist with case management, budget counseling, job searching, rental and utility arrears, and returning to a stable home environment

2. Veteran's Village (The Ritz)

- Transitional program for veterans who qualify.
 - 50 beds (47 for males, 3 for females)
 - Operated through a VA GPD-Grant per Diem program
 - The Ritz offer NA and AA meetings, monthly health Seminar, Wellness Recovery Action Plan amongst other programs to their residents.
 - Each resident has an Independent Living Counselor to work towards self-sufficiency.

3. Realizing Recovery

- Volunteers of America of Florida provides Substance Abuse Aftercare Services for adults in Ocala at **no cost**.
- We provide an environment of positive recovery that assist individuals in dealing with barriers to recovery.
- We identify coping mechanisms that promote both responsibility & allows for self-determination in their choices.
- We provide individual or group therapy by a licensed clinician with a focus in your recovery and building your recovery skills.
- Independent Living Counselor provides group sessions which focus on skills building, activities of daily living, budget, and job interview skills and resume.
 - **Eligibility:**
 - Individual **MUST** have **PROOF OF COMPLETION** from a Substance Abuse Program (can be a certificate or a letter on company letterhead)
 - Adults (18+) with a Substance Abuse history (and/or)
 - Co-occurring population, adult with a Substance Abuse & Mental Health Disorder
