Participate in one county level activity (not including the SEYF):

- County Events
- Seminole Garden
- Judging Team
- County Council
- Animal Workshops
- 4-H Camp Ocala or Day Camps
- Eat4-Health, ATV Safety, Kickball Kickoff, Holiday Bake-Off, National Youth Science Day Experiment, or any other county program offered

Complete at least one community service project

Participate in at least one county level fundraiser

Seniors Participate in one State or area activity:

- LAW (4-H Leadership Adventure Weekend)
- Leg (Florida 4-H Legislature program)
- 4-H University
- 4-H Camp Ocala (Counselor Program)
- 4-H District Council (County delegate)
- Intermediate State (for Intermediate 4-Hers)
- Executive Board
- Day at the Capitol (open to all 4-Hers ages 8-18)

***National Events program involvement (Citizenship Washington Focus, Leadership Washington Focus) is optional**

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4-H Club Management

- ✓ Follow and support the mission of the Marion County 4-H Program
- ✓ Attend quarterly leaders meetings (September, November, January and April)
- ✓ Submit all paper work on time (club charter or re-charter, affirmative action, plan of work, fundraiser request, field trip request, treasurer and secretary reports)
- ✓ Participation of club leader, co-leader, volunteers or club parents in the Marion County 4-H Volunteer Academy program
- ✓ Complete end of year exit interview
- ✓ Have at least 75% of enrolled youth meet or exceed standards of membership
- ✓ Provide a safe, nurturing environment for club meetings
- ✓ Serve as a liaison for the 4-H office and 4-H families
- ✓ Receive a leader/club re-appointment letter
